CITY BOARD AND COMMISSION RESPONSIBILITIES

<u>Budget Committee</u> – The Budget Committee was established by state statute to ensure citizen involvement in the preparation of the budget. The city budget is a joint effort between the people affected by the budget and elected officials responsible for providing the services.

The Budget Committee consists of the City Commission and an equal number (5) of appointed members of the community. An appointment member must be someone who is qualified to vote in elections within the City of Warrenton. Appointed members serve on the committee for three years. Budget meetings are scheduled in the spring of the year. There are usually four to six meetings scheduled during this time.

<u>Warrenton Community Center Advisory Board</u> – The Warrenton Community Center Advisory Board was created to oversee the operation of the community center. The board's principle goal is to ensure the community center is self-supporting from fees generated by the users, so it will not become dependent on property taxes. The board members are responsible to establish rules and policies for center development and operations.

The principle qualification for persons interested in the center is their willingness to assist the City in providing a community center building for our citizens. The board consists of five (5) members with each member appointed to a four-year term. Meetings are held monthly, or every other month, on the third Thursday of the month at 4:00 pm.

<u>Planning Commission</u> – The Planning Commission is responsible for conditional use requests, variances, and land subdivisions. They make recommendations to the City Commission on land use issues and any other matters relating to the planning and development of the city. The Planning commission is composed of seven members, with no more than two of the members engaged in the same occupation, business, or profession able to serve on the commission. The main qualifications for appointment to the planning commission are the desire to assist in the orderly development of the city. Members are appointed to four-year terms. The meetings are held monthly.

<u>Warrenton Parks Advisory Board</u> – The Parks Board was created in 2005 to assist the City in development of a Parks Master Plan and to advise the City Commission regarding any matter relating to city parks; policies, activities, care of park assets, funding and development of parks.

The principle qualification for persons interested in serving on the Parks Board is an interest in the development and care of Warrenton's Parks. The Board is made up of a minimum of seven (7) members who shall serve a three-year term. The Parks Board meets quarterly.

<u>Community Library Board</u> – The Library Board was established to operate a community-based library. The board members are expected to take an active part in the library operation and recommend to the City Commission rules and policies for the efficient and effective operation of the library, its services, and programs.

The main qualification for a board member is sincere desire to help provide library services for our community. There are seven (7) members on the board. The members serve on the board for four years and meetings are held quarterly.

<u>Urban Renewal Advisory Committee (WURAC)</u> - Established in 2008, the primary function of the WURAC shall be to advise the Warrenton Urban Renewal District and the Warrenton City Commission on all matters pertaining to the encouragement of infill, rehabilitation and redevelopment that is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Regulation adopted by the Warrenton City Commission as well as the Warrenton Urban Renewal District.

The Urban Renewal Advisory Committee is made up of seven (7) members who shall serve a two-year term. Membership is limited to those individuals who reside within the city limits of Warrenton or who own property within the city limits of Warrenton. The committee meets quarterly.

<u>Marinas Advisory Committee</u> - The Warrenton Marinas Advisory Committee was established in 2021. The primary function of the Marinas Advisory Committee shall be to review and recommend improvements to the performance and development of the Warrenton and Hammond Marinas as well as advise on general matters as staff requests to improve services and operations. The Committee shall work closely with the Warrenton Marinas Department, and will make recommendations regarding completion of or updates to a comprehensive marinas master plan to encompass both Warrenton and Hammond Marinas.

The committee is made up of five (5) members who shall serve a two (2) year term. The Committee shall contain at least one professional mariner, one member at large, and one commercial fishing user. The committee meets quarterly.
