Internet Safety is Important!

Everyone should be reinforcing internet safety! Every parent should be talking about internet safety, and every student should be committed to practicing internet safety! It's important. Your child's life may depend on it!

Tips for Students

1. Use only your first name. Do not give out your personal information or address or send pictures.
2. Never agree to meet someone you "met" online.
3. Don't believe everything you read. The person you think is a girl your age may be an older man.
4. If you become uncomfortable with anything you see or read online tell your parents or teacher.
5. Do not tell anyone your account password!!!

Tips for Parents

1. Place your computer in the most public room in your home.
2. Make ground rules for your child's internet usage.
3. Spend time using the internet with your child and encourage children to share sites they find online.
4. Tell your child not to ever give out personal information without your permission.
5. Make sure you are present if your child wants to meet someone they met online.
6. Tell your child not to respond to messages that may make them feel uncomfortable.
7. Inform your internet service provider of any inappropriate uses of the Internet found by you or your child.
8. Know what parental controls, (i.e. filters), can and cannot do and how they work.

Internet Manners

- Respect the privacy of others.
- Use the subject field in all e-mails.
- Don't type in all UPPERCASE. It's like shouting.
- Don't forward chain letters.
- E-mail is not private, use it as if your grandmother might see it.
- Don't copy things and pretend that they are yours.
- Don't illegally copy music or computer programs. It's stealing.
- Don't try to break into other computers. It's a crime!
- Always practice "The Golden Rule" online!
