



PEDESTRIAN SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS ALONG MAIN AVENUE ARE COMING!

The City of Warrenton is planning two improvements that will improve safety for everyone traveling to and from the Grade School and along Main Avenue. Improvements include:

- Widened corners at the SW 9th Street and Main Avenue intersection to make it easier and safer for school buses to turn
- A new set of walkways between SW 10th Place and SW 9th Street so pedestrians won't need to walk along the shoulder of Main Avenue
- Enhancements to the existing crosswalk on Main Avenue at 9th Street, including a new, pedestrian-actuated warning flasher.
- Replacement of existing street lights with LED lighting to improve visibility at night.

The walkway project is funded by a Safe Routes to School grant through the Oregon Department of Transportation. It is the first phase of a plan to eventually extend the walkway south on Main Avenue to the High School, including crossing enhancements similar to the one planned at SW 9th Street.

Members of the project team will be available to show the proposed improvements and answer questions, as well as talk about when these projects are expected to get underway. There will be opportunities for providing comments on the design as well.
