5. Business Items

A. Consideration of Director's Report:

Executive Director Esther Moberg provided a project update: the Peterson Property preliminary design has been completed, building permits have been issued for the Outpost

Building, the Battery 245 project is wrapping up and has received a temporary occupancy permit, and the Food Cart Pod has 4 active carts, with space for one more.

She reviewed the top priorities list: Warrenton Marina dock design, the purchase of a new Library Building, and the Peterson Property. There was brief discussion on façade improvement grants.

B. Consideration of Peterson Property Design:

Moberg reviewed the preliminary designs for the Peterson Property and noted the recommendation from WURAC. There was brief discussion on the project and feasibility.

Chair Balensifer stated for the record, "because I know some people probably asking is why aren't we spending money on the other side of Alder like, you know, with bathrooms that are beat up and like soap dispensers and all that, the Urban Renewal Agency District does not extend that far. So the Urban Renewal Agency cannot spend money on that side of the city."

Chair Balensifer asked if the Agency wished to revisit the list and look for somewhere else to see what \$200,000 will go to or do they want to go ahead on this and kick it to the parks advisory board to see what they feel. Each commissioner shared their opinions. There was a majority opinion to keep the project with amendments.

Chair Balensifer noted the WURAC recommendation. He noted the response to the advisory board would be assuming that the project is approved and moves forward that they concur with the suggested improvements. There were no objections.

After further discussion there was a majority consensus in favor of the project including extending the paved multiuse plaza to be brought through to Alder Ave. and keeping the rest of the plan.
